COSRT has several non-Registered membership categories. These are for those not active as fully trained or active as Psychosexual / Relationship Therapists. All within these categories share an interest in and support of COSRT's work. The categories are:

- Affiliate - For those with an interest in the work of COSRT who want an association outside professional activity. In other organisations this category might be referred to as 'Friend of...'.
- Student – For those in training and education.
- Professional Associate – For those working in and around Psychosexual and Relationship Therapy, but ineligible for Registration. Including health and social care professionals, newly qualified therapists, generalist and other specialist psychologists and therapists.
- Retired - For Members who are on a long career break or are retired.

Benefits

Membership in these categories gives a range of benefits:

Fees

Affiliate Member

Affiliate Membership is not open to practicing therapists. They must apply for Professional Associate or Registered status depending on their circumstances.

Affiliates are not members of COSRT for the purposes of company law and do not have a right to attend, speak, vote and/or demand a poll at general meetings of COSRT.

Student Member

Eligibility

You can apply for COSRT Student Membership if you are enrolled on any of the following courses:

- Specialist psychosexual or counselling training on psychosexual and relationship issues¹.
- General psychotherapy and/or counselling.
- Psychology or medical course with a specialism or focus on psychosexual/relationship issues.

Public Listing

As a Student Member of COSRT you will be listed in a public registry of COSRT Students. This ensures that if you have supervised client hours within your studies, the public can confirm your status.

Membership duration

If you successfully graduate from your course, you must inform COSRT immediately. At that point you will be moved to Professional Associate Membership. You will remain at this level until you complete a successful application for Registered Membership.

If your studies end for any reason, you must inform COSRT immediately. In that scenario your Membership will be changed to Affiliate or Professional Associate depending on your circumstances.

Specialist Practice

If your course contains client contact hours, or you have client contact hours outside training you must:

- Have supervision in place at a level of 1:6 per month.

¹ You are required to hold COSRT Student Membership if you are on a COSRT-Accredited Course.

- Have professional indemnity insurance at a minimum value of £2,000,000.
- Be in good professional standing.
- Make your student status clear to all parties.

As a COSRT Student Member you must not claim or allow it to be believed that you are a qualified Psychosexual and Relationship Therapist.

Registration

If you are a student but meet criteria for COSRT Registered Membership, you can apply for that status. In that scenario, you must maintain Registered Membership until graduation when on a COSRT-Accredited Course. Registered Membership allows you to advertise as a qualified, registered Psychosexual and Relationship Therapist.

Professional Associate

Key Information

You may be granted Professional Associate Membership of COSRT if you are working in and around Psychosexual and Relationship Therapy, but ineligible for Registered Membership.

If you are eligible for Registered Membership you must apply for that status.

Specialist Practice

Professional Associates cannot advertise or practice as Psychosexual and Relationship Therapists or any iteration of the specialism.

Those active in any health and social care field including general psychotherapy and counselling or another speciality therein, must be covered by insurance at a minimum level of £2,000,000.

Retired Member

Key Information

You can apply for Retired Membership if you have been a COSRT Registered Member (or above) for 12 months or more and that you are:

- Retired; or
- On a break from practice that will end no sooner than 12 months from the date of application.

You must also commit that:

- You will not undertake any practice for the duration of your membership as a Retired Member.
- You will inform COSRT immediately if you return to practice.
- You will ensure you follow all COSRT guidelines on returning to practice.

Application Process

Applications for membership should be sent via email to memberships@cosrt.org.uk.

Confirmation of your application outcome will be sent to you electronically. If your application is accepted by COSRT, your subscription fee will be taken via Direct Debit or bank transfer. If the subscription fee is not received within three months, your application will lapse, and you must reapply. Your membership will be valid immediately from the date on which payment is received by COSRT in cleared funds.

COSRT reserves the right to request an applicant to attend an interview with representatives of COSRT to discuss their application. The applicant would be expected to meet their own travel costs to attend the interview.

The provision of misleading information or an incomplete declaration may lead to refusal of entry to membership or withdrawal of membership at a future date. Membership of COSRT does not commence until the annual subscription has been received (subject to COSRT's confirmation to you of a successful application outcome).

Membership of the College for Sexual and Relationship Therapists is not a qualification and must not be represented as such.

Applicants may appeal a decision concerning their application in accordance with clause 3.9 of the Terms and Conditions of Membership and Accreditation and the Guidelines for Reapplication and Appeal.
